What is WordPress?

WordPress is a website and blogging platform provided free to post-secondary educators and students through a [provincially-hosted installation](#) organized by BC teaching and learning leaders (Open Educational Technology Collaborative - OpenETC).

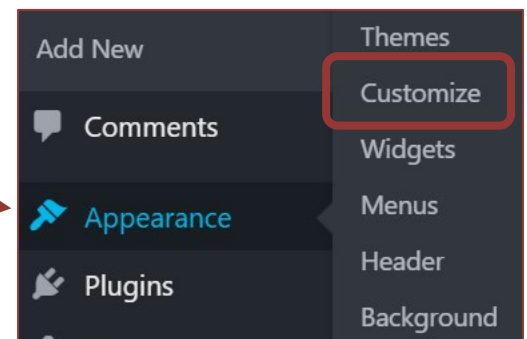

Site Customization and Settings

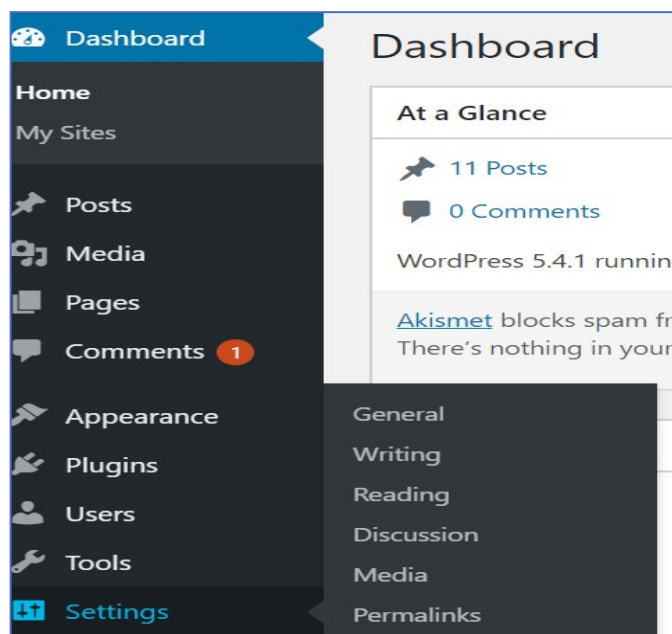
You can customize the of your site in many ways. Click on **Appearance** on the left-hand side. This will bring up a new menu.

Clicking on **Customize** will allow you to change the **Site Identity** (site title, tagline), **Images**, **Menu** and **Home Page** setting. The options available under **Customize** will vary according to which **Theme** you choose.



Within **Settings** you can:

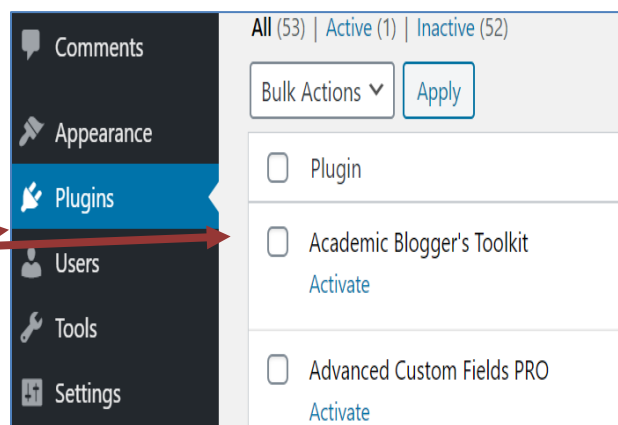
1. Change the **Site Title**, add a **Tag Line**, set the **Site Language** and set the **Timezone** under **General Settings**.
2. Set your site to **Classic Editor** or **Block Editor** under **Writing Settings**.
3. Adjust how your **Posts** are displayed on your homepage under **Reading Settings**.
4. Adjust the settings for how people can add **Comments** to **Posts**, how **Comments** are moderated, and set your notifications, under **Discussion Settings**.
5. Adjust the dimensions of your images when added to your **Media Library** in **Media Settings**.
6. Customize the **Permalinks** for your individual pages and blog posts to make them easier for people to type in and remember by clicking on **Permalinks Settings**.



Plug-ins

Plugins extend the feature set of your site. To find out which **Plugins** you have on your site:

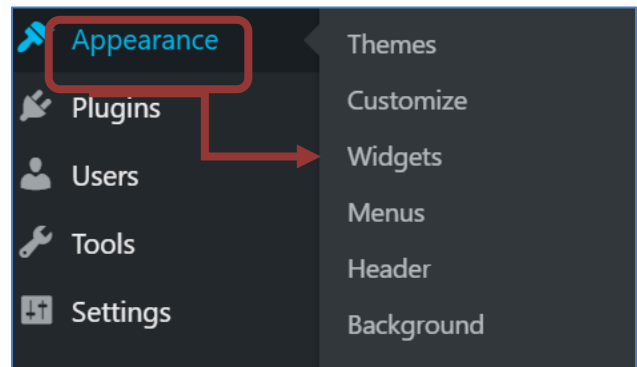
1. Click on the **Plugins** tab on the left-hand menu. A list of available **Plugins** will appear, with a brief description of its function.
2. Click in the box next to the **Plugin** you want to install. A check mark ✓ will appear.
3. Click **Apply** to add the checked **Plugin** to your site.
4. Note that not all **Plugins** will work with every theme.
5. A useful **Plugin** to add if you are going to make your **WordPress** site public and allow people to leave **Comments**, is Akismet, which is a special **Plugin** that allows you to filter spam out of your **Comments**.



Widgets

Other features include **Widgets**. **Widgets** are blocks of content that you can add to your site, such as a calendar or a footer. To find the **Widgets** available for the **Theme** you have chosen:

1. Click on **Appearance** in the left-hand menu.
2. Select **Widgets**.
3. A selection of **Widgets** for you to choose from will appear. Click on the one you want and follow the instructions for adding that **Widget**.

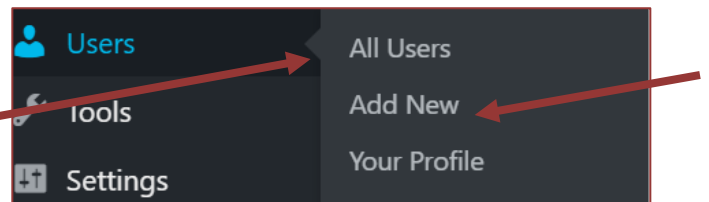


Adding Users

To add users to your site:

1. Click on **Users** on the left-hand menu.

2. A new menu will appear:



All Users allows you to delete existing users or change individual user permissions.

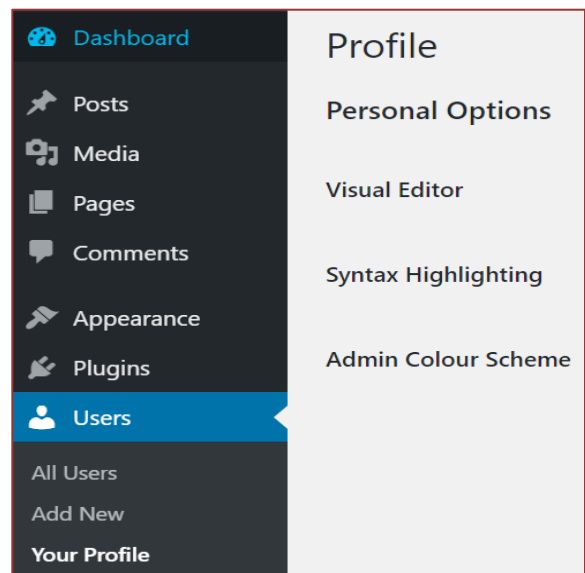
Add New Users allows you to add people to your site, with different levels of permission:

Administrator – can do anything with the site, including delete it.

Editor – has permissions to edit and create all content within the site, but not to add or delete users.

Author – can create, write, edit and publish their own posts but nothing else.

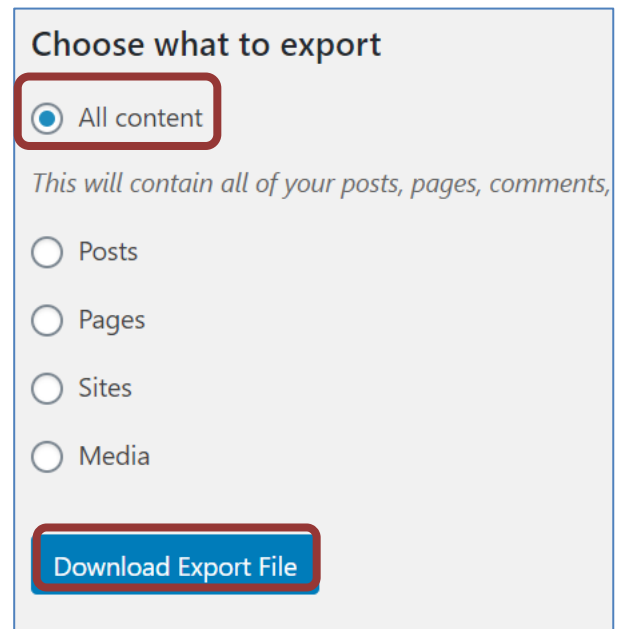
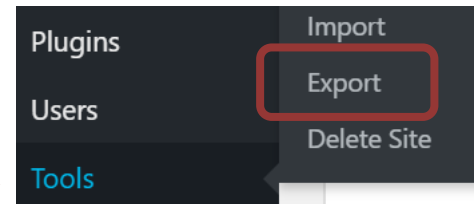
Under **Your Profile** – you can change the admin color scheme, add an additional email address, add biographical information, add a profile picture and hide your site.



Exporting your site as a back-up

It is possible to export the content of your WordPress site so that you can keep a back-up copy.

1. Click on **Tools** on the left-hand menu.
2. Choose **Export** from the menu that appears.
3. Choose which part of your site you would like to export and then **Download Export File**.
4. A file will be generated that you can save to your computer.
