

LIBRARY OPEN HOURS

Computer Use

Students can book a computer space in the library or borrow a laptop on a first-come, first-served basis.

Borrowing Books & Media

To borrow a print book or a DVD you can place a hold on a book or DVD and pick it up in front of the library.

BOOKING ORIENTATIONS & CLASS VISITS

The Library & Learning Commons (LLC) offers several academic supports and services to help students with the work they do in your classes. We have found that the best way to make students aware of these supports is to visit your classrooms and give brief presentations at the beginning of the semester outlining what supports we have and how to access them. In addition, we also provide more in depth workshops tailored to your specific needs.

ACADEMIC SUPPORTS

The Library & Learning Commons provides academic supports in an inclusive and supportive environment to help students make their academic year a success.



RESEARCH SUPPORT

Research Support is available via BlueJeans, by phone, email, and AskAway chat service. Students learn to create effective search strategies, choose and evaluate resouces, cite and avoid plagiarism



RITING SUPPORT

Writing Support develops student writing skills for academic success. Students can meet with a faculty member via BlueJeans or submit their written work for free feedback from highly trained online WriteAway tutors.



PEER TUTORING

Students learn new approaches to studying and writing with NIC's free peer tutoring service. Tutors are highly trained to help students achieve success in all levels of English, math, science, humanities, trades, nursing and business.



MATH SUPPORT

Math Support is a support service provided via BlueJeans where students groups can spend time working on all levels of math problems with the support of NIC math faculty.




STUDENT TECH

CLASS GUIDES

CITATION GUIDES



We have created guides for APA, MLA, and Chicago style that provide students with instruction on building and formatting reference lists and in-text citations for a large variety of information sources.

RESERVES

Library staff can assist Faculty with scanning articles or book excerpts to be posted on BlackBoard while ensuring the documents adhere to Copyright standards. We are not currently offering hourly reserves to comply with the 72 hours required to quarantine the books after their return.

COPYRIGHT

The Library has designed a copyright guide that you can access from the library website. The guide explains how to use licensed NIC library resources and how you can post links to resources in LEARN and class handouts while adhering to copyright standards.
